A STORY OF CHARITY AND FORGIVENESS

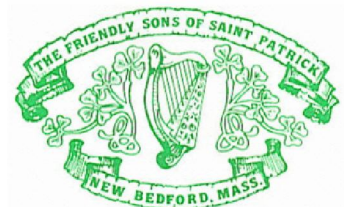
Richard Moore was born in Derry, Northern Ireland in 1961. At age 10 while walking home from school, he was struck in the face by a rubber bullet and left blind for life. Despite his blindness, Moore has always believed that he was more fortunate than most and dedicated his life to helping others, founding Children in Crossfire (www.childrenincrossfire.org). This outstanding charity works with local organizations abroad to deliver projects on the ground, protect the rights of vulnerable children and provide them access to clean water, food, health and education.
